




Figure 3. Typical Reverse Current

Figure 4. Maximum Reverse Current




Figure 5. Current Derating Per Leg




Figure 6. Forward Power Dissipation Per Leg




Figure 7. Typical t_{rr} Characteristics, $T_J = 25^{\circ}C$




Figure 8. Typical t_{rr} Characteristics, $T_J = 125^{\circ}C$




Figure 9. Typical IRM Characteristics, T_J = 25°C




Figure 10. Typical I_{RM} Characteristics, $T_J = 125$ °C




Figure 11. Typical Thermal Response





Figure 12. Typical Capacitance
