**Caution** - Strongly recommend that only taxi cabs arranged by Amkor Anam and the hotel be used.

**GENERAL INFORMATION:**

Amkor Anam has minimum footwear requirements everywhere in the factory. Visitors will be issued special footwear prior to leaving the lobby. Amkor Anam has a class 100/5000 clean room and visitors will be issued special fabric footwear, smock and a bunny suit prior to entering the clean room.

Visas: Not required with a valid passport and a return ticket if you plan to stay 21 days or less.

Language: The national language is Filipino, with English as the most widely spoken second language.

Climate: Tropical, with two seasons - hot and dry from November to June and rainy from July to October.

Currency: As of press time, the exchange rate of the Philippine peso to the US dollar is approximately P26.00 = US\$1 with hotel exchanging at approximately P25.50/\$1.

Taxes: Tax of 13.5% will be levied on services and purchases.

Tipping: The standard tip is 10% of the total bill or fare. Most hotels and restaurants though include a 10% service charge. In this case tipping is optional.

Time: Philippines is 8 hours ahead of GMT.

Electricity and other Utilities: AC 220 volts. Many major hotels also have AC 110 volt outlets. Water in Metro Manila is considered potable. Deluxe and first class hotels and restaurants also supply mineral water.

The State Department suggests that you take two or three wallet size photos overseas, in case you need to replace your passport or decide to visit an additional country that requires a visa.

Take photocopies of credit cards and your drivers license with you and store someplace other than with the originals.

Proof of ownership required for computers and cameras.
