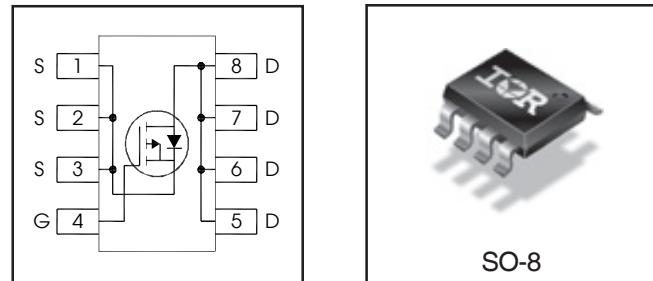

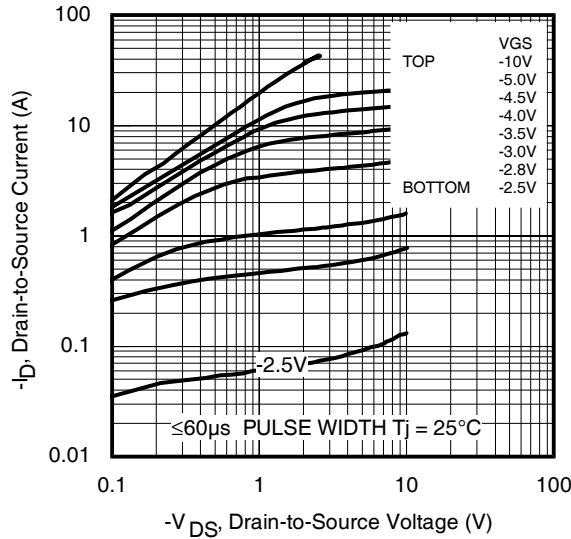


Fig 1. Typical Output Characteristics

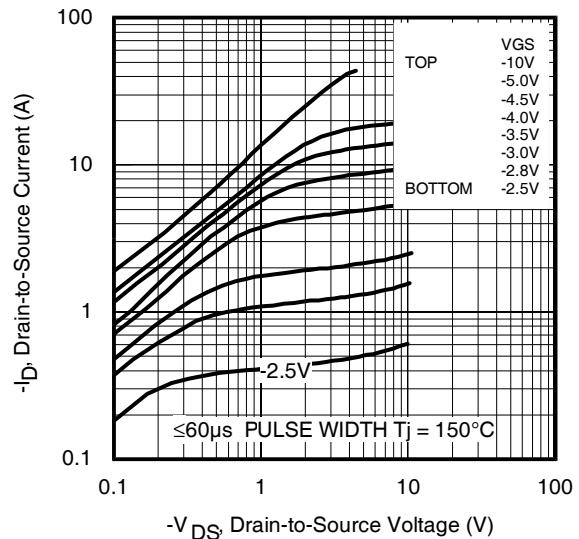


Fig 2. Typical Output Characteristics

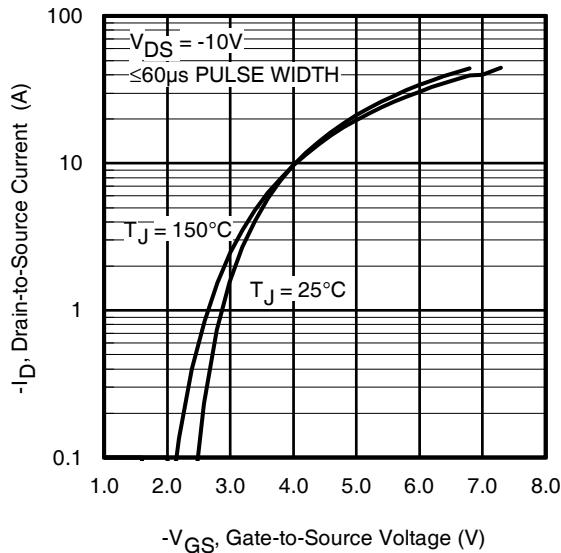


Fig 3. Typical Transfer Characteristics

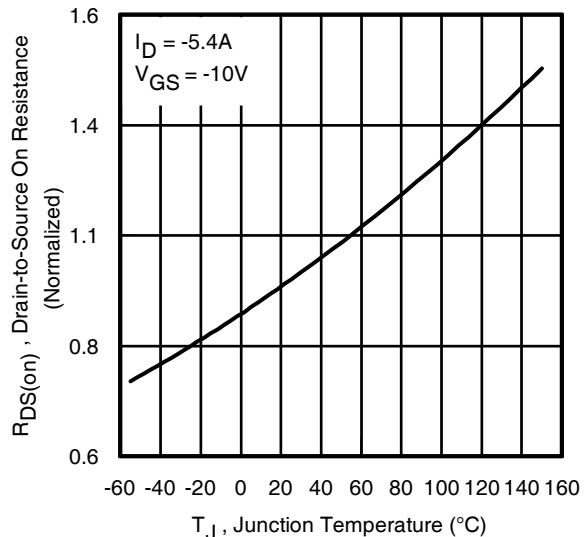


Fig 4. Normalized On-Resistance vs. Temperature

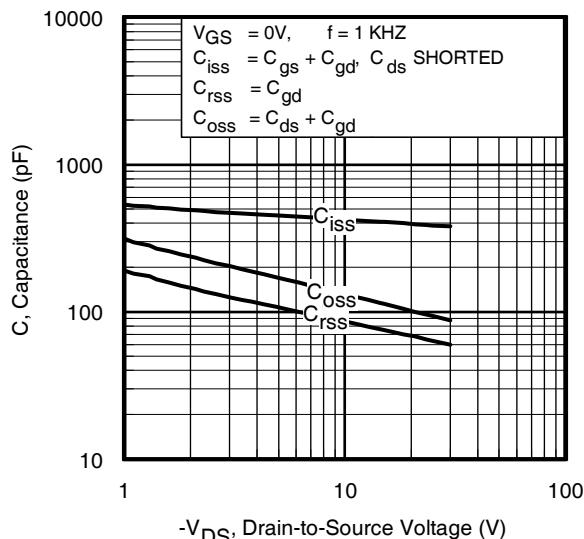


Fig 5. Typical Capacitance vs. Drain-to-Source Voltage

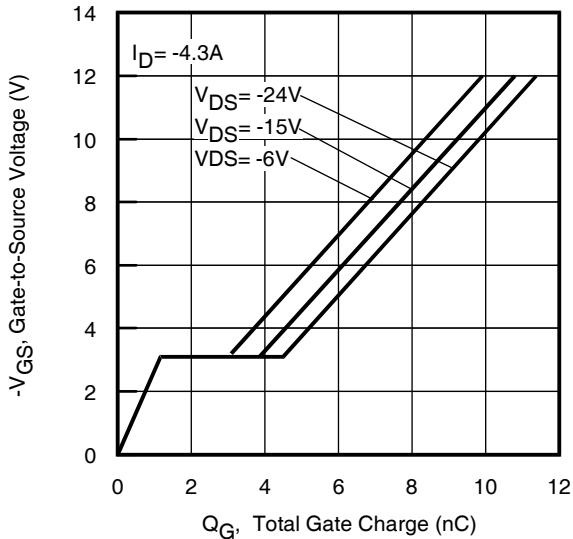


Fig 6. Typical Gate Charge vs. Gate-to-Source Voltage

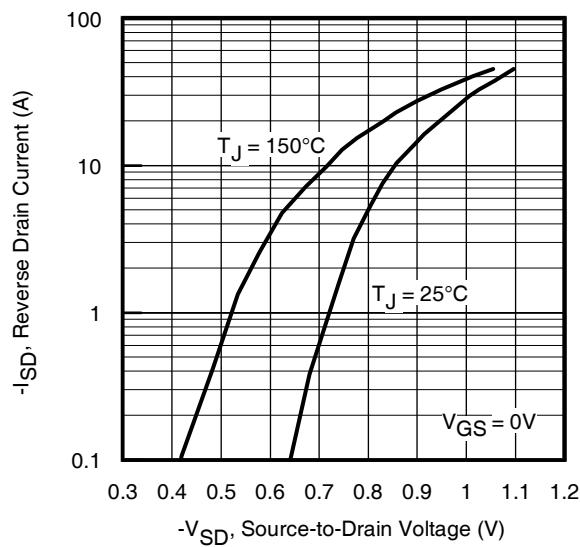


Fig 7. Typical Source-Drain Diode Forward Voltage

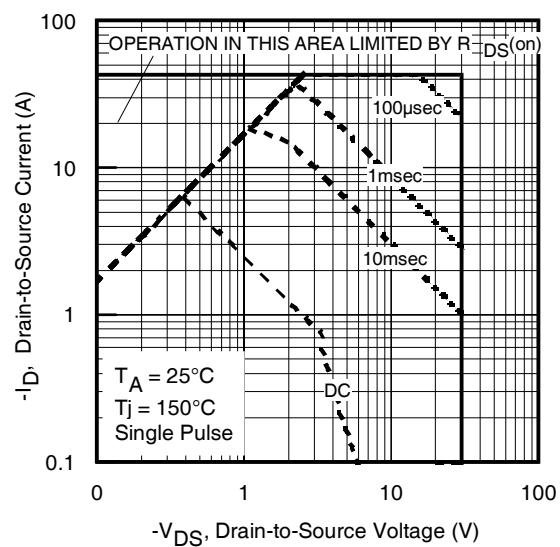


Fig 8. Maximum Safe Operating Area

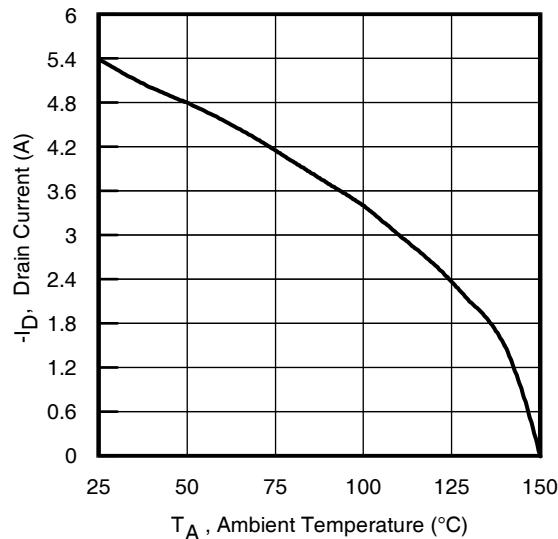


Fig 9. Maximum Drain Current vs.
Ambient Temperature

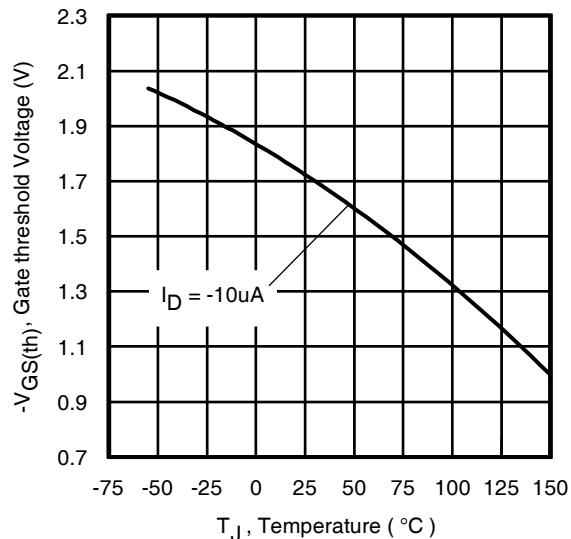


Fig 10. Threshold Voltage vs. Temperature

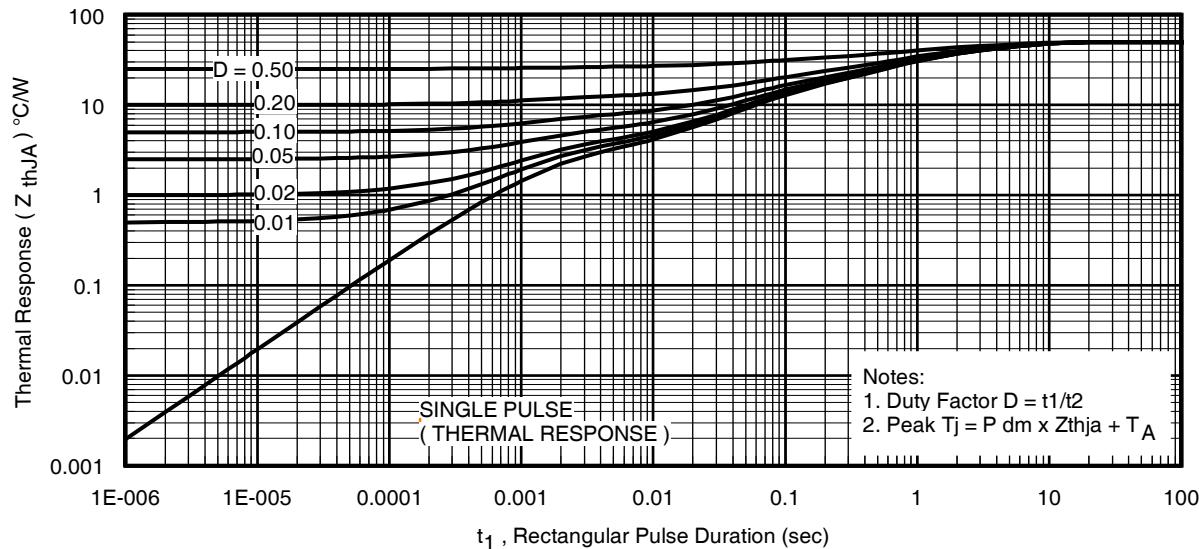


Fig 11. Maximum Effective Transient Thermal Impedance, Junction-to-Ambient

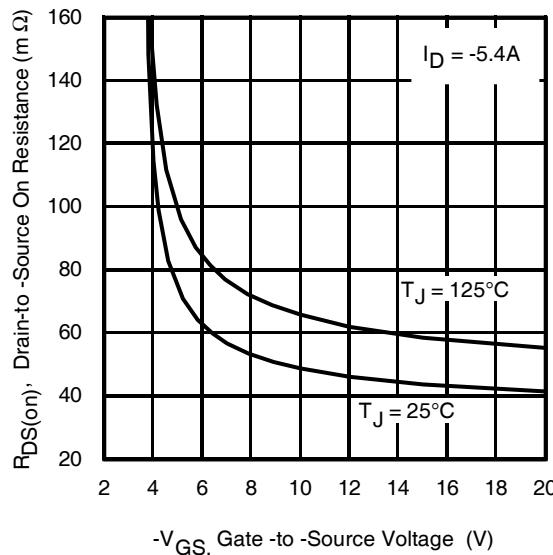


Fig 12. On-Resistance vs. Gate Voltage

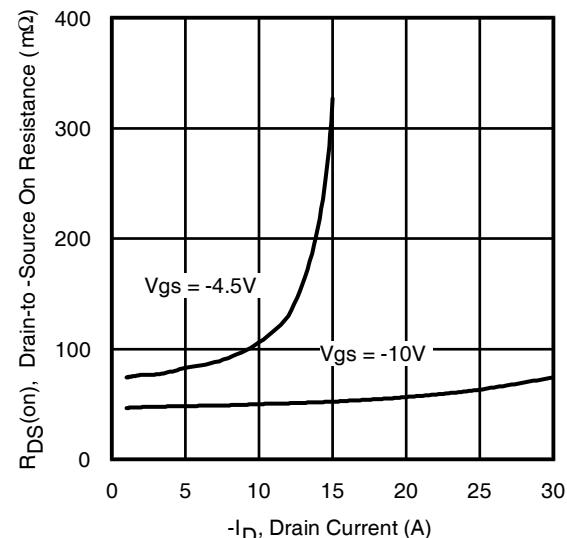


Fig 13. Typical On-Resistance vs. Drain Current

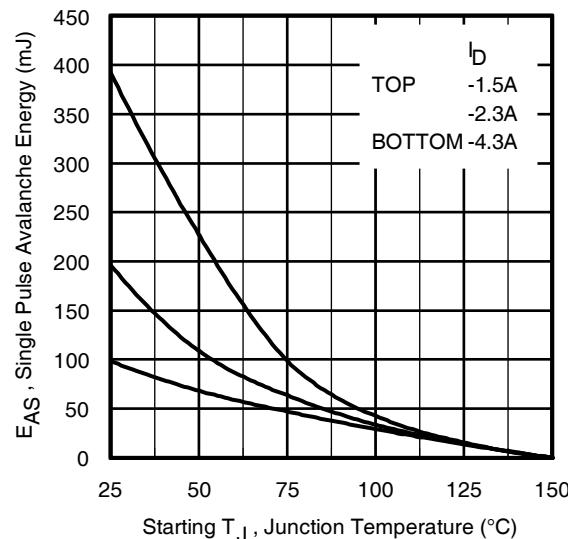


Fig 14. Maximum Avalanche Energy vs. Drain Current

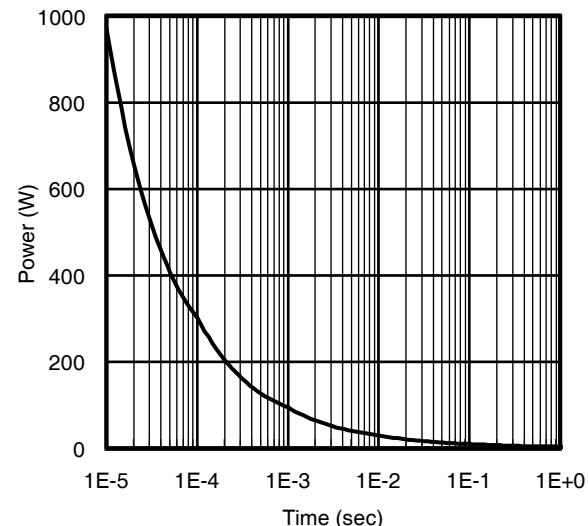


Fig 15. Typical Power vs. Time

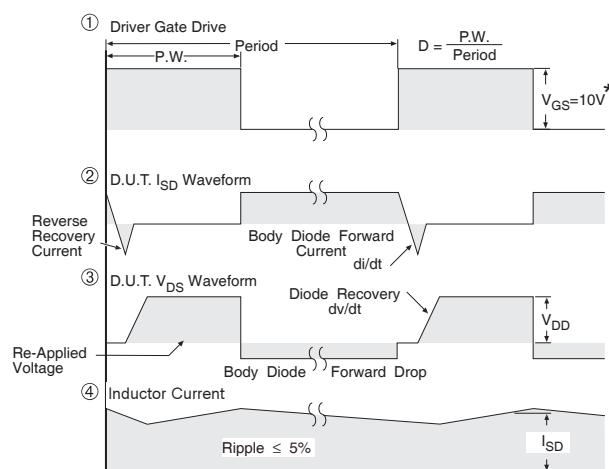
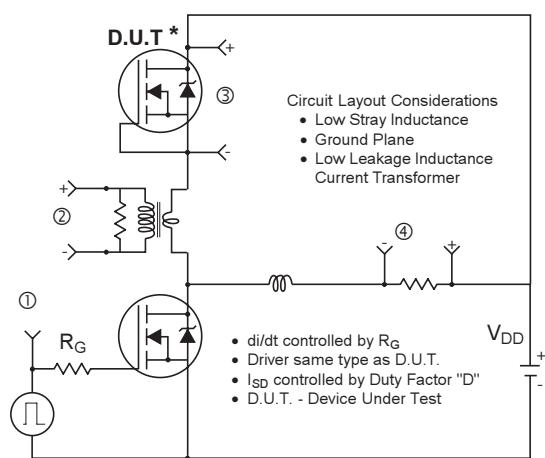


Fig 16. Diode Reverse Recovery Test Circuit for P-Channel HEXFET® Power MOSFETs

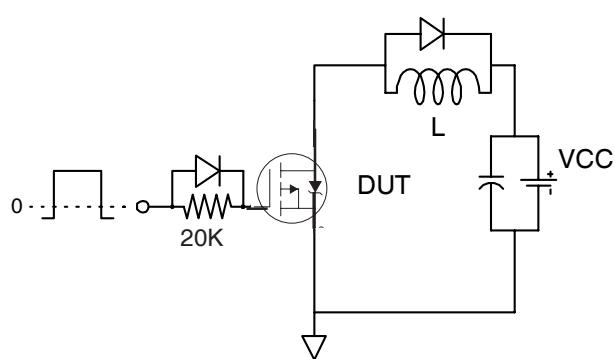


Fig 17a. Gate Charge Test Circuit

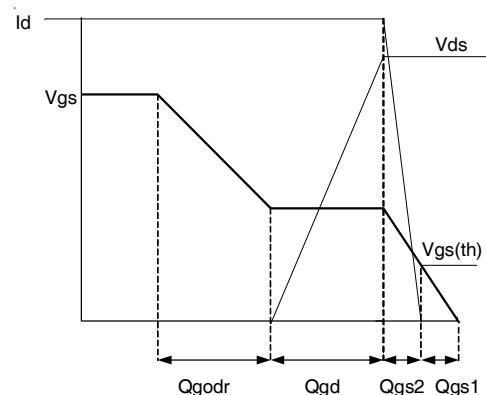


Fig 17b. Gate Charge Waveform

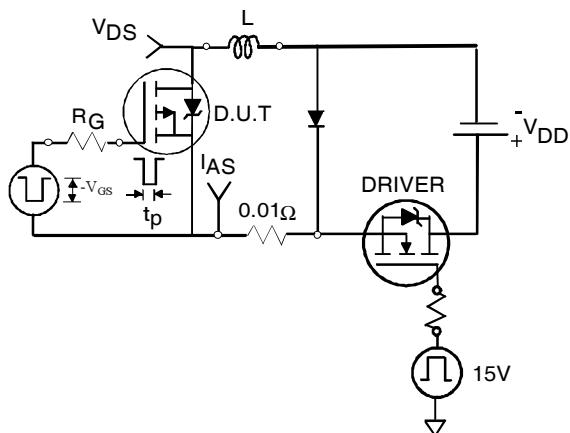


Fig 18a. Unclamped Inductive Test Circuit

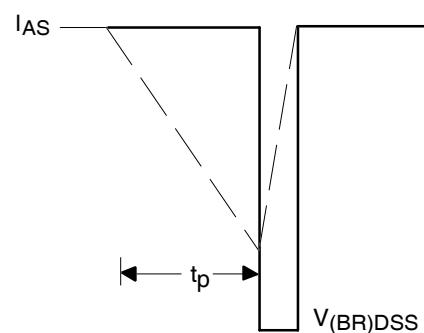


Fig 18b. Unclamped Inductive Waveforms

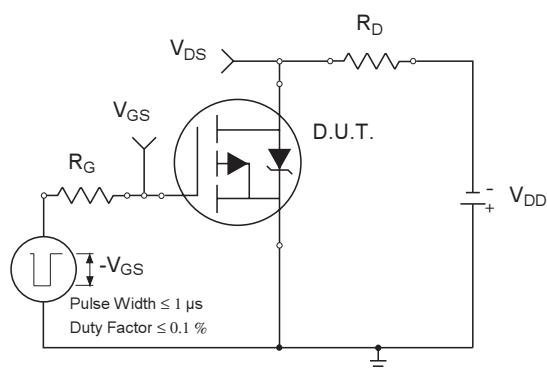


Fig 19a. Switching Time Test Circuit

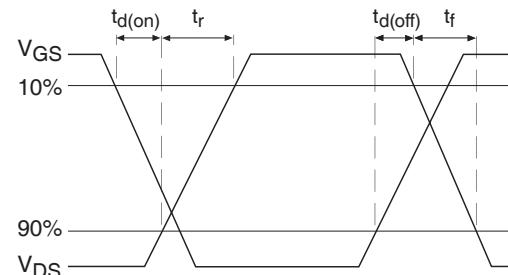
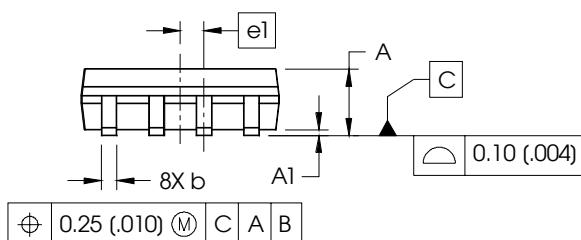
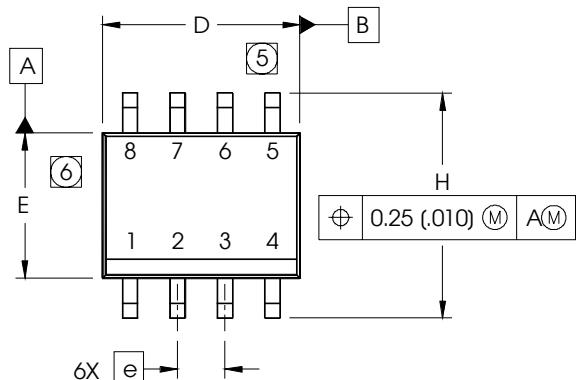


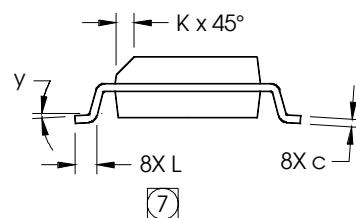
Fig 19b. Switching Time Waveforms
