

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




Fig 1. Typical Output Characteristics




Fig 2. Typical Output Characteristics




Fig 3. Typical Transfer Characteristics




Fig 4. Normalized On-Resistance vs. Temperature

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


Fig 5. Typical Capacitance vs.
Drain-to-Source Voltage




Fig 6. Typical Gate Charge vs.
Gate-to-Source Voltage




Fig 7. Typical Source-Drain Diode
Forward Voltage




Fig 8. Maximum Safe Operating Area




Fig 9. Maximum Drain Current vs.

Fig 10. Threshold Voltage vs. Temperature




Fig 11. Maximum Effective Transient Thermal Impedance, Junction-to-Case

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


Fig 12. On-Resistance vs. Gate Voltage




Fig 13a. Unclamped Inductive Test Circuit




Fig 13b. Unclamped Inductive Waveforms

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


Fig 13c. Maximum Avalanche Energy vs. Drain Current




Fig 14a. Switching Time Test Circuit




Fig 14b. Switching Time Waveforms

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



Fig 15. Peak Diode Recovery dv/dt Test Circuit for N-Channel HEXFET® Power MOSFETs




Fig 16. Gate Charge Test Circuit





Fig 17. Gate Charge Waveform


