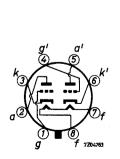

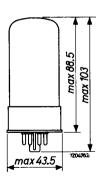

SHOCK AND VIBRATION RESISTANCE

The following test conditions are applied to assess the mechanical quality of the tube. These conditions are not intended to be used as normal operating conditions.

Shock

The tube is subjected 5 times in each of 4 positions to an acceleration of $500~\rm g$ supplied by an NRL shock machine with the hammer lifted over an angle of $30^{\rm o}$.

Vibration

The tube is subjected during 32 hours in each of 3 positions to a vibration frequency of 25 Hz with an acceleration of $2.5~\rm g$.

LIFE

Production samples are tested during 500 hours.



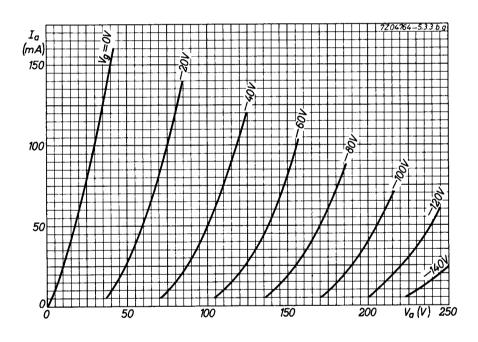

With fixed bias the anode circuit should contain a protective resistance to provide a minimum drop of 15 V d.c. at the normal operating conditions. When two or more sections are used in parallel at dissipations approaching the rated maximum, separate anode and cathode resistors must be used to assist load sharing.

When combined fixed and automatic bias is used, the cathode bias portion should have a minimum value of 7.5 V d.c. at the normal operating conditions. $R_{\mbox{\scriptsize g}}$ should then not exceed 0.1 $M\Omega$.
