THE SOCIETY OF AMERICAN NATURALISTS. MEETING OF THE CENTRAL BRANCH.

THE Central Branch of the Society of American Naturalists held its annual meeting at the University of Michigan during Christmas week, the American Zoological Society, the Association of American Anatomists, the American Physiological Society, the Society of American Bacteriologists, the Society for Plant Morphology and Physiology, and the Botanists of the Central States meeting in conjunction with it.
