THE SILLIMAN LECTURES AT YALE UNI-VERSITY

DR. HANS SPEMANN, distinguished experimental zoologist of the University of Freiburg, will give a course of lectures under the Hepsa Ely Silliman Foundation at Yale University during October, 1933. The title of the course is: "Embryonic Development and Induction." The subtitles for the seven lectures of the course are as follows:

Early experiments and fundamental concepts of experimental embryology.

Factors involved in the development of a compound organ (the vertebrate eye).

On the development of the amphibian egg, its pattern and potencies up to the early gastrula stage.

Experimental induction of a secondary embryo and the rôle of induction in normal development.

Time-correlation in the induction system; regional determination; the embryonic field.

The means of induction; its character as a stimulating factor; the tendency of the organizer to form a whole.

The application of the facts presented; experiments on other forms; conceptions and theories.

The lectures will be given in Strathcona Hall, beginning on Wednesday, October 11, at 4:15 p. m. and at the same hour and place on October 13, 16, 18, 20, 23 and 25.
