

### RANSON-CLARK'S ANATOMY OF THE NERVOUS SYSTEM

**New (8th)  
Edition**

More than ever before, this book can be described as the most generally useful textbook of neuro-anatomy in the English language. For the *New (8th)*

*Edition*, Dr. Ranson's material has been revised, brought up-to-date by Dr. Sam Lillard Clark, Professor of Anatomy at Vanderbilt University Medical School. He has altered the plan of the book somewhat to enable the student to progress more logically through the study.

As before, the subject is considered from the *dynamic* rather than the static point of view—emphasis throughout is on the developmental and functional significance of structure. Included in the new and revised material are discussions of localization of function of the cerebral cortex and cerebellum; innervation of choroid plexus; functional composition of trigeminal pathways; new data on the cochlear, vestibular and optic nerves; new method of plotting dermatomes by sympathetic ganglionectomy; new classification of thalamic nuclei<sup>f</sup>.

### MASSERMAN'S DYNAMIC PSYCHIATRY

In this book, virtually all of the leading and accepted systems of modern psychology and psychiatry are presented. Each is given a sympathetic evaluation, their differences and similarities pointed out, and each analyzed and translated into medical terms. In a word, this book deals with the principles of psychiatry in action, such action leading to definite conclusions of a clinical character. The neuroses and the psychoses are given extended consideration and methods are set down whereby the findings of psychoanalyses can be evaluated. Two important features of the book are the *Glossary* containing definitions of over 1000 current technical terms, and a *Bibliography* consisting of some 1200 titles.
