The successful applicants' duties will include maintaining and standardising recording geomagnetic and seismological equipment, processing photographic records and carrying out preliminary evaluations to be made in Canberra during the following year. Qualifications should be a degree or better from an appropriate University and passes in physics and mathematics at second year standard and one or more of the following subjects: geophysics, physics, geology, mathematics, electronics or electrical radio, or mining engineering at third year standard or other equivalent educational qualifications. An initial period of preparatory work will be spent in Canberra followed by approximately twelve months at the Station. Tentative sailing date: late December 1966. While absent from Australia, kitting and maintenance are provided free by the Commonwealth and there is an overtime allowance of 371/2 per cent of salary up to a maximum of \$1400 per annum. An additional district allowance of \$650 for married men and \$400 for single men is also paid. Recreation leave accrues at the rate of five weeks per annum. Subject to the provisions of the Income Tax and Assessment Act, Zone Allowance deductions of \$540 may be allowable. Applications will be considered for Antarctic duties in later years. Following this tour of duty with the Antarctic Research Expedition a transfer will be made to one of the appropriate divisions of the Geophysical Branch.

Salaries will be paid to the successful applicants from the date of embarkation at a United Kingdom (or other overseas) port. Fares of successful applicants and those of their families (if any) will be paid subject to the applicants completing a bond of service to remain in the service of the Commonwealth for at least three years.
