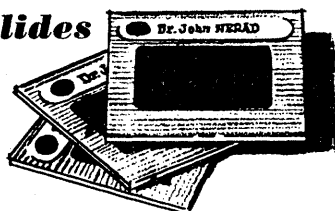


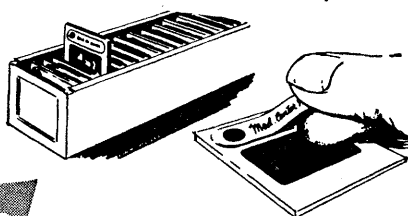

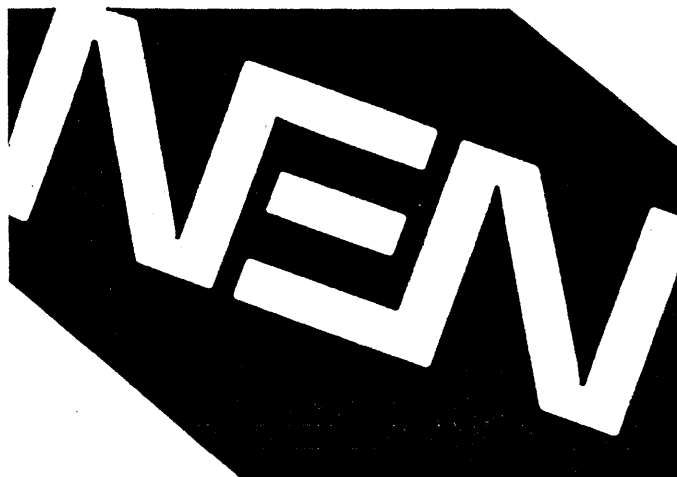


TIME red dot PHOTO-SLIDE LABELS
