In keeping with a long and honored tradition, the forthcoming AAAS Annual Meeting in Boston (18-24 February 1976) will be graced by an exceptional set of tours and special events arranged by the Boston Advisory Committee. Tickets should be ordered in advance, since many of these events are limited in their capacity; however, you may try your luck with obtaining tickets on site at the AAAS Ticket Desk in the Registration area on the second floor of the Exhibit Hall of the Hynes Auditorium. Information about Boston can be obtained at the Boston Advisory Committee Hospitality Room (Beacon D on the third floor of the Sheraton-Boston Hotel). Handicapped persons who need special assistance to participate should consult the staff in the Handicapped in Science Office (Beacon E, adjacent to the Hospitality Room).



From the Government Center, John Hancock Place and the Prudential Center, take a relaxed ride along the Charles River, driving by Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Harvard, and Boston University. After a look at colorful Harvard Square, return to the Sheraton-Boston Hotel.

Especially meaningful during the year of the nation's bicentennial celebration, this trip will take you from Longfellow's home on Brattle Street in Cambridge to Concord where Emerson and Louisa May Alcott lived, to the famous bridge from whence was fired "the shot heard 'round the world." Finish by visiting the famous Battlegreen at Lexington with its Minuteman statue.

3. University Tour \$6.60

Greater Boston is rich with colleges and universities and this tour will let you see some of them. Included in a relaxed ride are **28 NOVEMBER 1975**



Harvard, Radcliffe, Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Boston University, Northeastern, Brandeis, Wellesley, and many others. Whether renewing old school ties or making plans for the youngsters in the family, this is an ideal tour.

4. **Woods Hole Oceanographic Institution** \$6.50

A bus ride down the historic coast of Massachusetts to this research facility, famous for both deep-sea and inshore exploration, located on Cape Cod. A 2-hour tour and program will be presented by the staff of the Institution on their facilities and current research effort. The \$6.50 fee covers transportation; a box lunch is available for \$2.00. (Limit: 150 persons)

5. Massachusetts Audubon Society

\$7.50 Field Trip to Newburyport-Plum Island

This half-day visit to the Newburyport harbor estuary and adjacent Plum Island will reward you with large concentrations of wintering water birds. The frozen salt marsh of the area is one of the most reliable places in the northeast to see Snowy Owls. In addition to the abundant ducks there is a fine variety of gulls, including Iceland Gulls. (The trip is limited to 36 participants; make your reservations early.)

University Tours

These tours are all scheduled for Saturday, 21 February and, while there is no charge, there is a limit of 150 persons per tour.


