# AAAS Annual Elections: Preliminary Announcement

**▼**HE Association's 1986 elections will be held in late August. All members will receive ballots in the general election for presidentelect, members of the Board of Directors, and members of the Committee on Nominations. Each member who is enrolled in one of the 21 electorates corresponding to the AAAS sections will receive an electorate ballot for section chairperson-elect, member-at-large of the section committee, and members of the electorate nominating committee. In addition, seven electorates will elect Council delegates. Members who have not yet enrolled in an electorate are invited to inform the Association now of the electorate (section) of their choice.

Candidates for all positions are listed below. Additional names may be placed in nomination for any position by petition submitted to the Executive Officer not later than 21 July. Petitions nominating candidates for president-elect, members of the Board, or members of the Committee on Nominations must bear the signatures of at least 100 members of the Association. Petitions nominating candidates for any electorate or section position must bear the signatures of at least 50 members of the electorate. A petition to place an additional name in nomination for any position must be accompanied by the nominee's curriculum vitae and statement of acceptance of nomination.

### **New "Expedition" Benefit Announced for AAAS Members**

As a new benefit, AAAS members now have the opportunity to participate in Earthwatch Scientific Expeditions without paying the regular Earthwatch membership fee.

Earthwatch is a nonprofit organization that recruits volunteers to join researchers in field expeditions worldwide. Since 1971 Earthwatch has sent some 14,000 volunteers, ages 16 to 80, on 730 projects in 70 countries. Earthwatch sponsors scholars in every field of study. There are archeological excavations; surveys of plants, birds, or animals; underwater and environmental impact studies; as well as research in architectural history, public health, music, and dance. Each project is reviewed and selected from an extensive pool of proposals by a panel of scientists. The principal investigators in charge of these expeditions are among the leading scientists and researchers in their fields.

As a AAAS member, you may apply for an expedition without paying the regular Earthwatch membership fee. All expenses related to an Earthwatch expedition are fully tax-deductible, including air fare, and volunteer experience could take you to an exotic location on the other side of the world or a research site in this country. Should you decide to become a member of Earthwatch, and receive their quarterly magazine and many other benefits, you may do so at a reduced rate.

AAAS annual meetings and R&D colloquiums.

#### Pacific/Arctic Divisions Reminder

The Pacific and Arctic Divisions of the AAAS will meet jointly at the University of British Columbia, 8 to 13 June 1986. The meeting will occur during Expo86, a world's fair celebrating Vancouver's centennial

Among the meeting symposia are those on the Consequences of Disarmament; Cultural Pluralism and Health Care on the Pacific Rim; Long-Term Management of High-Level Radioactive Nuclear Waste; Recent Advances in the Ecology of Arctic Fishes; and Integrating Remote Sensing Information into Resource Management.

Geoffrey G. E. Scudder, president of the Pacific Division and professor of zoology, University of British Columbia, will present the presidential lecture, "Canada's Galápagos: The Queen Charlotte Islands." Other public lectures will be on "Flying Machines: Natural and Otherwise," "Flora of British Columbia," "History of Canadian-Alaskan Boundary Survey," and "It's Time We Made Evolution Respectable!"

A number of field trips will be available, including those to Hell's Gate, Victoria, and the Lower Fraser Valley.
