Fire and Ice . . . and Worms?

May I point out that the "Würmertod" referred to in the Vignette from Karl Sigmund's book *Games of Life: Explorations in Ecology, Evolution, and Behaviour* (Oxford Univ. Press, New York, 1993) in the issue of 29 April (Book Reviews, p. 727) means "death of the worms." This is not at all identical with the once-predicted *Wärmetod*, the hypothetical death of a universe coming into perfect thermal equilibrium. It is highly probable that the *Wärmetod* would be preceded by a *Würmertod*, although it must be noted that these hardy animals did manage to survive the *Wurm-Eiszeit*.

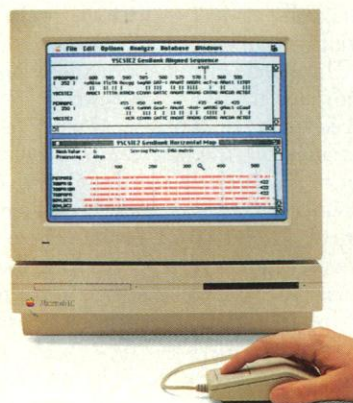

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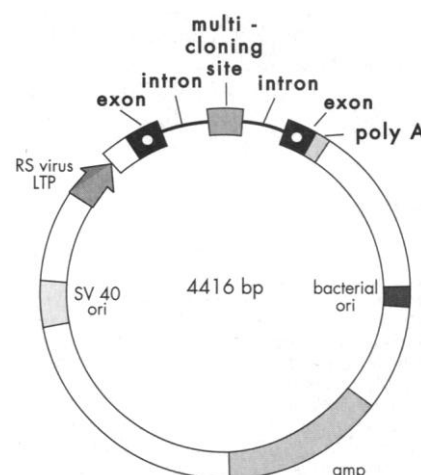
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
