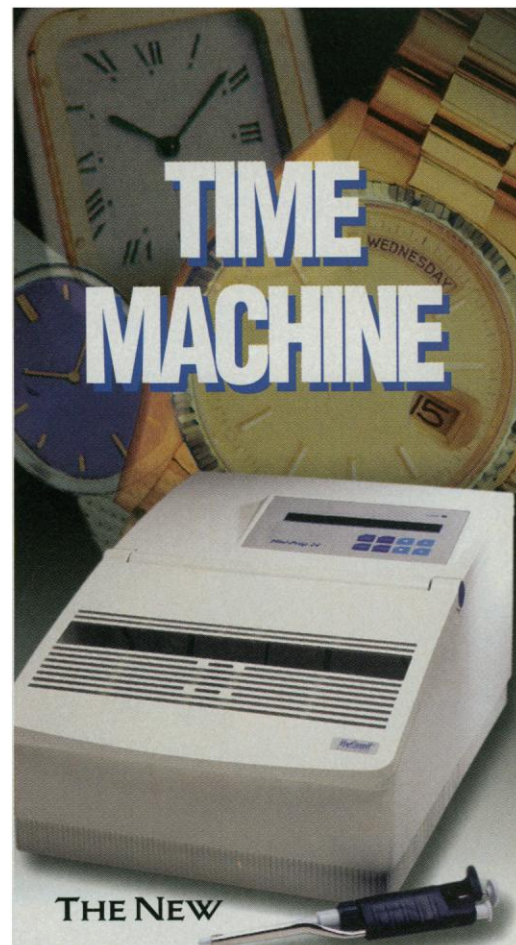
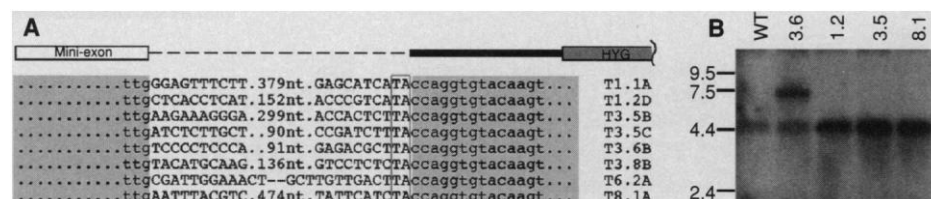
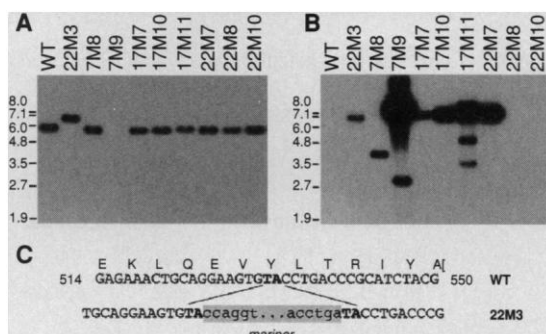
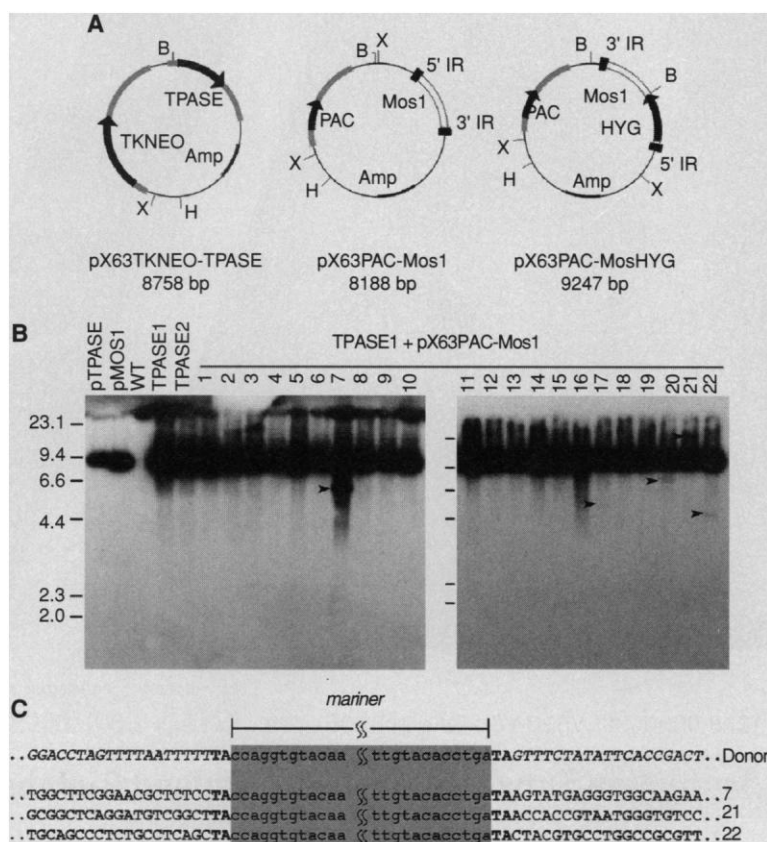


Corrections and Clarifications
