Death and Dying: An Examination of Legislative and Policy Issues—The proceedings of a AAAS regional seminar held in June 1976 can now be ordered from the Georgetown University Health Policy Center, cosponsor of the seminar, at 3520 Prospect Street, NW, Washington, D.C. 20057. The volume costs \$3.50 and includes papers on state legislative activity, demographic data, criteria for the determination of death, and legal and ethical implications of death and dying issues.

American Values and Habitat: A Research Agenda—Available free of charge from the Office of Public Sector Programs, AAAS. Adapting Science to Social Needs: Knowledge, Institutions, People Into Action—The proceedings of a AAAS conference held 5-8 May 1976 in Rensselaerville, New York, this 300-page volume includes conference presentations, workshop discussions, observations, conference evaluation, and bibliography. Plenary papers cover specific problem areas discussed at the conference, as well as examinations of the structure, process, and utilization of the results of problem-oriented interprofessional collaboration. Reports on conference workshops address conceptual aspects, alternate reward structures, management and organizational factors, user needs, and recommendations for change related to interdisciplinary research.
